#### Just in case you are wondering ----WHAT IS THE "HOWLING WOLF SALOON"?

As America grew westward, Saloons were there. Some in tents on creek banks, some at end of track on railroad construction. A couple of Whiskey barrels and a few planks was all that was need to start. As the west grew, the saloon continued to be the center of town for a cowboy, miner, business man or traveler. As Louis L'Amour described the Crystal Palace (a typical western Saloon) in "The Mountain Valley War".

> "The Crystal Palace was one of those places that made the West what it was. Wherever money was to be spent there would be found the saloons and gambling houses, yet they were not alone for drinking and gambling, for the western saloon was a meeting place, a political forum, a clearing house for information, a place where business deals were consummated, and a club room as well. Money was being made in the West, whether in cattle, buffalo hunting or mining, and the men who were making it were, largely speaking free spenders. They had the money and they wanted the best in rare wines, champagne, excellent food, and elaborate décor."

Fresh from engagements at High Sierra '05 and '06 and Durham Ferry '06 the Howling Wolf Saloon is proud to continue this fine tradition of being the center for social activities. As Cowboy Action shooting continues to grow, the Howling Wolf Saloon continues to evolve, improve and provide that Old West social atmosphere at annual Cowboy Shoots.

The Howling Wolf Saloon is an Old West Style Saloon in a tent that is all about social activities. Tables to sit and rest, talk, play cards, discuss your shooting prowess, or just lie about how good or poorly you shot. The saloon has a dance floor, the music is Classic Country juke box, loud enough for dancing, but easy to socialize. Organized gambling with Texas Hold 'Em tournaments both Friday and Saturday nights.

The Howling Wolf can not sell any food or beverages, but it does sell co-proprietorships good for the length of the event. One price for three days. Co-proprietors are entitled access to the bar, gambling area, music and dance floor areas as well as: adult beverages, including well drinks, ice cold draft beer, a wine bar and "Howling At the Moon Brandy "right from the barrel. We will be making margaritas, but no other fancy drinks, "this is a Cowboy bar, after all." For a social proprietorship, there are diet and non-diet sodas.
