WANTED: HELPIIII

The major agenda item at the Town Council meeting this month was the need for more help in running our club. After many years of hard work and leadership, most of the current club officers will be stepping down from the Town Council at the end of the year. They will be leaving big holes that will need to be filled by other club members! Maintaining a club the quality of 5 Dogs Creek requires all members to help in some way.

As the annual shoot seems to be the main reason why many club members resist taking a leadership role, it was decided that event would become a sub-committee of the Town Council. Fortunately, Portugee, Phillips, Almost Dangerous, Miss Becky Geo Kid and Ida Mistum, who have the organization of that huge undertaking down to a science, have agreed to continue in that capacity. They will need help, so if you're interested in being on that committee, let Portugee Phillips know.

With that out of the way, most other tasks needed to run the club the other 11 months of the year suddenly seem more manageable. Wouldn't you agree? Good thing! Here are some of the ways you can help...

• Registration at monthly matches:

Here's your chance to meet everyone who shows up at the range! Because Miss Becky is bonded, she is willing to continue as treasurer, but will no longer handle monthly match registration, scores or membership.

We need members who are willing to arrive a little early each month to welcome shooters and get everyone assigned to a posse. Heck! If we get enough volunteers, you might only have to take on one match a year. Basically, you'll be taking money/making change for the match, keep a posse list or have shooters sign themselves up on a posse and provide a welcome for the day. Once all shooters are signed-in, you'll pay David Olds, range owner, the portion of the match fee that goes to him. At the end of the match, you'll make sure the money gets to Miss Becky for deposit and get change for the following month.

Emma Pistol (Tami Leach) has agreed to keep a list of who will do registration for each month. If you're interested, give her a call at (661) 589-6831. *Hey*

cowboys, how about some of you step-up for this one! Doesn't have to be a cowgirl's job!

• Monthly scores:

Want the scores out more quickly? Maybe you'd like to have the scores announced right after the match? Here's your chance! Take the score sheets, compile the shooters into their appropriate category, list them by time (see page 3) and e-mail the list to the newsletter editor. If you want to work quickly after the match and announce the winners, go for it! Contact Miss Becky if you're interested in taking this on.

• Membership:

While most of our members join/renew in January, we do have newcomers throughout the year. If you have access to a computer and can keep the membership roster current, this is the job for you! The membership list needs to be updated each month to ensure everyone receives the newsletter and other announcements between matches. If you are interested, contact Miss Becky.

Posse Leaders/Range Officers:

This is the good-hearted cowboy who walks your posse through the shooters' instructions and often handles the timer. The handful of ROs that seem to get corralled every month are tired and would like some relief. If you have taken the RO class, step right up. Time to put your skills to work. If you are apprehensive about jumping in feet first (which is probably a good idea), let Geo Kid know and he'll pair you with an experience RO for a match. Good training and an opportunity to have questions answered.

If you're interested in taking the RO class (EVERYONE SHOULD DO THIS regardless of your interest in leading a posse – it's great safety/rules instruction), let Geo Kid know. He'll start a list and a class will be scheduled in the near future.

Monthly match sponsors:

Each year we have 11 matches to put together. It isn't all that hard to do, but we need new sponsors to step up. Don't be intimidated thinking you have to be overly

MEMBERSHIP DUES INCREASE PROPOSED

At the June Town Council meeting, a proposal to increase membership dues for 5 Dogs Creek was discussed. However, as there were not many members at the meeting, you need to make your opinion known.

The proposal is to raise annual individual dues from \$25 to \$35 and family memberships from \$35 to \$50 effective January 1, 2005. There will be NO change in the monthly match fees.

The basic reason for the increase is to offset climbing club expenses: insurance rates continue to go up; the new generator is costing about \$100 a month to run; the toilets need to be pumped; we need new targets and the price of steel has jumped. The monthly match fees DO NOT come close to covering costs — the club stays afloat on the money raised at the annual match.

To help offset the increase for families and to encourage more junior shooters, the monthly match fee for juniors (16 and under) will be waived. This is the practice of most cowboy action shooting clubs.

Additionally, if the increase is approved, a pro-rated fee schedule will be developed by Miss Becky for those who join late in the year.

If you have questions or concerns about the dues increase, contact Portugee Phillips. Now is the time to speak up. You input is valued and needed! A decision will be made on this issue by August.
