SAFETY TIPS FROM OUR SHERIFF, MESCALERO

BEST WAY TO GET FIRST AID AND CPR TRAINING

I've been researching the best way to provide first aid and CPR training so that we will have a pool of club members ready and able to respond in case of any emergencies on the range. My original hope was to have classes offered on the range on Saturday afternoon during a shoot weekend...but the logistics make that a difficult option to implement.

The best option I have found is for club members to sign up for classes through their local Red Cross chapter. Each chapter has a quarterly schedule of courses open to the public, and classes are available in 4-hour blocks in both daytime and evening sessions. Cost is the same if we had conducted the class on the range or at a Red Cross classroom, but there are many more scheduling options using the Red Cross open-enrollment classes.

I shared the type of emergencies we are most likely to face at 5DC (and our need to be self sufficient for 30-45 minutes given expected response times for an ambulance to the range) with Gaby Tamayo, Health and Safety Coordinator for the Kern Red Cross. She suggests that the best starting place for club members is the Standard First Aid class, which is a 4-hour class available for \$35. Students who complete the class successfully receive a 3-year first aid certificate. Gaby's suggestion for more advanced training would be the Adult/Child/Infant CPR class. This is a 6 hour class offered for \$45 and successful students receive a 1-year CPR/AED certificate. There are full day sessions for first aid and CPR combined, if that is the offering that best matches your schedule.

Here's my suggestion:

- 1. Go to your local Red Cross website and click on the class schedule (for most club members, that is www.KernRedCross.com)
- 2. Look for a convenient date, then call a few of your 5DC buddies and enroll as a group. It will be a lot of fun to attend with a few friends.
- 3. Attend the class...and feel good that in the event of an emergency, you are better prepared to help your friends and family.
