March Match & Membership Meeting Both Successful

The March Match weekend started with a great work party on Saturday. Lots of weeds were cut and some general maintenance done. Many, many thanks to Ten Bears for bringing his tractor with the large mower attached. If it hadn't been for everyone's efforts, we would not have been able to have a match on Sunday. Several bays were so covered with weeds that you could hardly see the targets. Thanks again to all who pitched in.

Nine Lives, you "done good" with the match design. The scenarios did require the shooter to think but you kept them fun. What else could anyone ask for? Certainly not Tom Doodley-Squat. He managed to shoot the whole match clean and won with an overall time of 171.03. Congratulations!

A General Membership meeting was held Saturday afternoon. Our Mayor, Portugee Phillips, presided. Miss Becky gave us a financial report outlining the monthly expenses vs. income, and showing the importance of the Annual/State Match income. Blarney Stone discussed e-mailing the newsletter to everyone with Internet access. This will save quite a bit of money each month that can be used for range improvements and other projects. Printed copies will still be sent to members without e-mail service. Portugee reviewed the dress code, emphasizing that all shooters must be in appropriate cowboy attire. He also announced that the next membership meeting would be held on May 3, at 2:00 p.m., after the work party.

Two motions were presented and passed. First, \$5000.00 was authorized to purchase a generator large enough for all the range buildings. We will have power not only for the annual match but also for each monthly shoot. The second motion passed allocated \$2500.00 for construction of an "adobe mission" on Bay 4.

Work parties are going to be held the Saturday before the monthly match from 8:00 Am till 12:00 noon. We'll need lots of help, especially with the persistent weeds. Please bring your rakes and weed choppers. Also, bring a shovel to fill in the squirrel holes. If we have many hands, it will make the work lighter and more fun. If you want to be more involved and feel a part of 5 Dogs Creek, come out for the work parties.

Although daylight savings time happens on Saturday night, April 5th, we will still have our shooter's meeting at 9:30 AM and the match begins at 10:00. Both of these times are Daylight Savings Time. We will start our regular summer hours in May (8:30 AM meeting and 9:00 AM match).

Several things were discussed concerning the Sunday Match. First, let's try to help Miss Becky and her crew in the registration office. For the April match, the registration office will be open from 8:00 AM until 9:30 AM. In May, the office will be open from 7:00 AM till 8:30 AM. Once the shooter's meeting starts, no more sign-ins. So don't be late and get left out.

If you are sharing guns and/or carts you must sign in early. Our matches are becoming so large that it's getting difficult to assign you (or your group) to a certain posse if you come late. The earlier you sign-in the better your chances of getting the posse you want.

If you feel the need to have a bite to eat during the matches, please bring your lunch or snacks with you to eat along the way. We cannot take "lunch breaks" because it makes the day run into late afternoon. And that makes it very hard for some of our members who have over 150 miles to drive home.

It was decided that shooters at the loading and unloading tables could continue their loading/unloading while people were down range. **BUT REMEMBER TO KEEP THE MUZZLES POINTED INTO THE BERMS WHILE AT THE TABLES.** And, please do not leave the loading table until called by the range officer holding the timer. He or she is the only one who can give the all clear and call for the next shooter.

Beginning in May, we will have a couple of stages set up for a practice fun shoot. We'll also be starting a "Goat Roper" shoot for the kids who are younger than the regular Junior class. Details on both of these will be in the next newsletter.

SPECIAL EVENTS PLANNED

On Saturday evening, April 5th, dinner will be followed with a movie. First, dinner will be a potluck. Bring your choice of meat (steaks, chicken, hamburger or hot-dogs) to grill on the BBQ and bring a side dish/desert to share with others. Also, bring your own drinks, utensils, plates, etc.

After dinner, you will want to stay for a showing of Shanghai Noon. Mescalero and Calgary Kate are designing the April match around the film. So bring some popcorn and be ready to laugh.

Doc James has agreed to give a Range Officer I class as well as a RO II class. We hope to schedule these for a Saturday in May. Cost is \$10.00 per class. It is hoped that each 5 Dogs member will take the RO I as it increases the safety on the range. RO II is more advanced and you must have already had RO I. The plan is for Doc to hold the RO I class in the morning and
