A small, but enthusiastic, group of shooters took part in the July match. The five stages written by Bodie Rose each included a great starting line to signal "shooter's ready." Bonus targets, on-the-clock reloads, creative shooting orders and the use of some targets that haven't seen lead in some time also added to the fun of the day.

"She is only a bird in a gilded cage" was the line recited to start Bay 6. After 10 pistol shots on a large target, a single pistol reload rewarded some with a 10 second bonus for hitting a smaller target. The stage directions made it clear that the bonus shot was just a bonus; miss doesn't count as a miss...just a bummer.

Rifle reloads were part of the stage on Bay 7. The scenario started by saying, "Hey, that's my mine your heading for" while sitting in the outhouse and firing off a few shotgun rounds while still seated. At the hallway entrance, 10 rifle shots were alternated between a target on the ground and the bell in the mineshaft. Two rifle reloads were meant for two additional targets at either side of the bay. The grand finale included 10 pistol targets all lined up for a quick...and fun... finish.

Remembering Smokey Joe

Cowboy action shooters recently lost one of the sport's finest gentlemen, California Smokey. Known to most at 5 Dogs Creek as Smokey Joe, Joe Burton passed away in his sleep at home on May 23 at the age of 77.

Smokey was one of the most kindhearted, honorable individuals you could ever hope to meet. He always arrived at the range well dressed with a big smile...and hugs for the ladies. His shooting attire was that of a tinhorn gambler *(his words!)*, but the clothes couldn't hide his real personality.

A principled man, Smokey was a kind soul with a zest for life. Decent. Respectable. Considerate. Hard working. He epitomized "spirit of the game" and "the cowboy way" in every aspect of his life. All those who knew him are blessed and will remember his virtuous character, wit, laughter and never-ending smile. He loved to share stories about his service to our country in World War II as a naval aircraft gunner. At cowboy matches, just for the fun of it, he often shot his shotgun from the hip like he used to do off the stern of navy ships.

Smokey had many hobbies that he fully enjoyed. In addition to shooting muzzle loaders, he enjoyed model trains, traveling, and he built



and flew radio-controlled model airplanes — some nearly as big as his back bedroom.

With a heavy heart, we say "happy trails" to Smokey Joe. We will carry his memory fondly.

CALIFORNIA SMOKEY: HE CAN SHOOT 'EM DOWN AND KEEP 'EM FLYING

California Smokey, aka Joe Burton, loves things that fly. Sometimes he likes to shoot them down and sometimes he helps them in for a safe landing.

"I fly model airplanes," said Joe, who has an impressive customized shelf built onto the bed of his truck for carrying his planes, some of which have a wingspan of close to seven feet. "I built my first plane when I was 10 years old and started flying again about 13 years ago."

He flies his planes up to four times a week in the hills near Mesa Marin Raceway and now races with other model plane enthusiasts. The maiden voyage of his newest racing plane, which he expects will reach speeds up to 130 miles per hour, is on course for the very near future.

Flying and shooting became part of Burton's everyday life while in the Navy.

"I joined the Navy in 1944 and was trained as a gunner on a torpedo bomber. The day I completed training, the Japanese surrendered. I guess they knew I was coming," Burton said with a laugh. During operational training, Burton spent eight weeks on a shotgun range. "We shot so much that we actually got bored shooting skeet," he said. "We would shoot clay pigeons from the hip just for fun."

Now, at age 74, Burton still loves to shoot from the hip and often shows cowboys at 5 Dogs Creek how it's done. And, he seldom misses.

"Shooting is fun for me. My days of winning may be gone, but I really do like to shoot," said Burton who used to shoot sporting clays and varmint matches and continues to actively participate as a muzzle-loader.

Introduced to Cowboy Action Shooting about six years ago, Burton seldom misses a match. He is known to most 5 Dogs Creek citizens as Smokey, but recently changed his alias when he became a SASS member to California Smokey.

"The name Smokey Joe was given to me when I was shooting sporting clays," he explained. "At station four I would hit the clay pigeons and there would just be nothing

left. They would say that I 'really smoked' and the name just stuck."

Although he grew up on a dairy farm, he does not fancy himself as much of a cowboy. However, he is always armed with a smile and a kind word, and California Smokey epitomizes the "spirit of the game."
